Kingdom	David	Israel	1-2 Samuel, 1-2 Kings, 1-2 Chronicles: David, the greatest king in the new monarchy, is followed by a succession of mostly unrighteous kings, and God eventually judges Israel for her sin, sending her into exile.

5/14	1 Sam 15:1-16:23	<i>God rejects Saul for disobedience (cont'd)</i> - Saul destroys the Amalekites - The Lord rejects Saul - Saul pleads for forgiveness - Sam executes King Agag Saul and David <i>Sam anoints David</i> - David serves in Saul's court	
5/15	1 Sam 17:1-18:4	<i>David and Goliath</i> - Goliath challenges the Israelites - Jesse sends David to Saul's camp - David kills Goliath - Israel routs the Philistines	
5/16	1 Sam 18:5-19:24	<i>David and Jonathan become friends</i> - Saul becomes jealous of David - David marries Saul's daughter - Saul tries to kill David	
5/17	1 Sam 20:1-21:15	- Jonathan helps David <i>Saul pursues David</i> - David runs from Saul	
5/18	1 Sam 22:1-23:29	- David at the cave of Adullam - The slaughter of the priests - David protects the town of Keilah - David hides in the wilderness	
5/19	1 Sam 24:1-25:44	- David spares Saul's life - The death of Sam - Abigail intercedes for Nabal - David marries Abigail	
5/20	1 Sam 26:1-28:25	- David spares Saul again <i>Saul's defeat and death</i> - David among the Philistines - Saul consults a medium
